## Incredible finish to an incredibly busy year!

Last month we were so proud to announce our post-hurricane cleanup efforts resulted in some staggering collection totals. (See the infographic we posted in early November!)

And although there's more work to be done, the fall totals are in. A total of 590 volunteers collected <u>157,655</u> pounds of trash from October through December!

Dear Keep Manatee Beautiful Friends,

I am filled with gratitude for the dedication each volunteer showed when helping Keep Manatee Beautiful pick up after a devastating hurricane season. By the end of our fiscal year, Sept. 30, KMB had 71,534 pounds of trash over 882 cleanups with roughly 3,000 volunteers. That was an impressive follow up to 2023 when we amassed 100,000 pounds of trash collected. But I was truly amazed by what happened next. In the wake of the hurricanes, 590 volunteers collected 157,655 pounds of trash from October through December!

We've got huge plans for 2025 (see our calendar of events on page 4!) giving you, our volunteers, more opportunities to help restore Manatee County from the devastating hurricane impacts of last year. I was so inspired by our volunteers and their determination in the weeks following those storms. It was difficult in very muggy conditions. But Manatee residents didn't bat an eye, cleaning and clearing debris everywhere we could find it.
